## SCHOOL MESSENGER

#### Are you using it?

Thank you to all parents/guardians for your patience as we roll out our automated attendance system. We know there have been some kinks which we are actively working on.

We have noticed a number of our families still not using the app to it's full potential. It is meant to make life easier - not harder.

1. **Download** the correct app: **SchoolMessenger** 



- 2. Make an account using the email address you have on file at the school. Your students will automatically link.
- 3. SET YOUR PREFERENCES:

Bottom right 'My Profile' > Preferences > 'St Paul Education' from the dropdown menu.

• From here you can see which contact methods are available, and choose how you will be notified. For example, you can set a work number as 'Do Not Call', while your cell phone can be set to call or text for various types of communications.

#### Now you're set!

- Report absences in advance by clicking 'attendance' in the bottom center of the main screen.
- 2. Forgot to report? If you get a text/phone call/email, follow the prompts to report whether you are aware of the absence.
- **Encourage your students not to be late.** Notifications go out <u>automatically after 15 minutes</u> of class.

This app also allows us to send text/email notifications about upcoming important dates, emergencies, and other communications. Please **DO NOT block the number** or you risk missing important

information!





### School fees will be accepted using School Cash Online in an effort to minimize traffic in our schools and increase efficiency.

School Cash Online helps parents and community members pay school-related fees safely, quickly and easily.

Please note: You do not need your child's student number. For security purposes St. Paul Education is not using unique student identification numbers. Please ensure "I do not have the student number" is selected when registering.

Also, upon registration you will be asked if you would like to receive notifications via email. We strongly encourage you to say yes to this request in order to receive future notification of items available to purchase online.

#### How to create an account

- 1. Go to https://sperd.schoolcashonline.com and click Register. You can set a default language at the bottom of the SchoolCash Online site.
  - Type your first name, last name, and email address, and create a password.
  - Select a security question.
  - Select YES to receive email notifications. You will not receive any marketing emails. Selecting YES enables the system to send you notifications about school fees and items.
- 2. SchoolCash Online will send you a registration confirmation email. If you do not receive it, check your Spam folder.
- $3.\,$  Use your email address and password to log in.

#### How to add a student to your account

- 1. Sign in to SchoolCash Online through <a href="https://sperd.schoolcashonline.com">https://sperd.schoolcashonline.com</a>.
- 2. From the menu at the top of the page, navigate to MY ACCOUNT.
- 3. From the dropdown menu, select My Students.
- 4. Click to add a student.
  - Type in your School Board Name.
  - Select your school name from the list.
  - Enter student details. The system is fully secure, with PCI certification.
  - Click Confirm.

- 1 . You will be able to view any available items or forms attached to your students that are set up on your account.
- $2.\,$  Select the item which you would like to purchase/complete and click "Add to Cart."

### **POST-SECONDARY APPLICATIONS**

Mrs. Morrison is available to help students with applying to post-secondary. If you are applying to a post-secondary institution in Alberta, you can apply online through the ApplyAlberta website. If you are thinking of going out of province or out of country, please talk to Mrs. Morrison, as your application process will be different. Also keep in mind that University of Alberta has entrance scholarship applications due January 10th and UCalgary as well on December 1st. USask also has a Best & Brightest Scholarship due Dec 15. Applying early will give you access to these applications.

### **AFTER YOU APPLY**

After you submit your application, it's very important to check your emails regularly as well as the mail. You typically will get an email shortly after you apply stating your student ID number and instructions on how to access your student portal with that school. Please read the whole email carefully as they will outline your next steps to securing your offer of admission or of further evaluating your application. It's <u>VERY</u> important to be checking the student portal every week and if you are able to, your college email address.

## HIGHLIGHTS



## National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

On September 30, students and staff across the Division participated in learning activities focused on the history of residential schools and the ongoing journey of reconciliation. Special guests were invited to share their stories, songs, and wisdom, enriching the experience for all. The Division remains committed to fostering understanding, healing, and reconciliation with our Indigenous communities.

### **Post-Secondary Night**

The annual Post-Secondary Night was successfully held on October 8, 2024, with 19 post-secondary institutions from across Alberta in attendance, along with representatives from the RCMP and Canadian Armed Forces. Students and families had the opportunity to explore various schools, ask questions, and gather valuable information on admissions, programs, and student life. The event was well-attended and provided a great platform for exploring post-secondary options.

#### **Dual Credit Grant**

The Division is pleased to announce that it has successfully received two Dual Credit grants from Alberta Education. These grants will allow high school students to take post-secondary courses in the trades while still completing their high school diploma. Students can earn high school and post-secondary credits simultaneously, explore various career fields, and reduce education costs. Through this new grant program, students will have the opportunity to complete their first year of post-secondary training in a trade while still in high school.

#### Racette Crosswalk and Bus Lane

The Board of Trustees made a motion to address ongoing traffic congestion concerns near École Racette School, which is located at a busy intersection along a major highway. Recommendations from the transportation department will be reviewed, and the Board will explore the feasibility of implementing additional safety measures.



### **Mallaig Planning Update**

As part of the School Construction
Accelerator Program, the replacement
of École Mallaig School has been
approved and design work is now
underway. The Division is working
closely with the Government of
Alberta to expedite the completion of
this project.



#### **Student Enrolment**

There has been a slight increase in student enrolment across the Division. While the financial impact of this growth is still being assessed, it is a positive indicator for the Division. Further details regarding the financial implications will be shared as they become available.

### **November Board Meeting Date**

The fall break is scheduled for November 12–18, 2024. The November monthly Board meeting will remain as scheduled on November 13, 2024.

## Technology Update Presentation

A delegation from St. Paul Regional High School presented feedback on the transition to a new technology system in classrooms. Large TVs have replaced Smartboards, offering improved visibility and sound quality. The mobile microphone and computer systems have been beneficial as they allow teachers greater flexibility to move around the classroom. The Division thanks staff for their efforts in learning to navigate these new devices for the benefit of their students.

The delegation also provided feedback on the ministerial order Standards for the Use of Personal Mobile Devices and Social Media in Schools, which took effect in September. Overall, students are adapting well. A group made up of trustees, school leaders, and central office representatives is working on a draft administrative procedure, which will be shared for review. The final version will be completed by January 2025.
