School Messenger



Are you using it?

Thank you to all parents/guardians for your patience as we roll out our automated attendance system. We know there have been some kinks which we are actively working on. We have noticed a number of our families still not using the app to it's full potential. It is meant to make life easier - not harder.

- 1. Download the correct app: SchoolMessenger
- 2. **Make an account** using the email address you have on file at the school. Your students will automatically link.
- 3. **SET YOUR PREFERENCES**:

Bottom right 'My Profile' > Preferences > 'St Paul Education' from the dropdown menu.

 From here you can see which contact methods are available, and choose how you will be notified. For example, you can set a work number as 'Do Not Call', while your cell phone can be set to call or text for various types of communications.

Now you're set!

- 1. **Report absences in advance** by clicking 'attendance' in the bottom center of the main screen.
- Forgot to report? If you get a text/phone call/email, follow the prompts to report whether you are aware of the absence.
- 3. Encourage your students <u>not to be late.</u>

 Notifications go out <u>automatically after 15 minutes of class.</u>

This app also allows us to send text/email notifications about upcoming important dates, emergencies, and other communications. Please <u>DO NOT block the number</u> or you risk missing important information!







Want to reduce your Exam Anxiety? Exam Taking Preparation

Make sure you practice on sample tests, and ask for suggestions:


- What to expect on the exam
- What course materials to emphasize
- How to prioritize

DO:

- Plan to rest well the night before
- Plan to arrive early for the exam
- Plan to monitor your time during exam

AVOID:

- Drinking coffee the night before and during the exam
- Anxious or talkative students
- Other people who may disturb your selfconfidence, focus and relaxation



CONTROL:

- Wear layers of clothing so you can adjust your need for warmth to cool
- Drink water, chew gum or bring a snack
- Bring pens, pencils, calculators etc.

PLAN:

Check out the room before if possible.

- Where is it located?
- How long does it take to get there?
- Where do you want to sit?
- Is there a clock?
- What is the room temperature?

How to create an account

- 1. Go to https://sperd.schoolcashonline.com and click Register. You can set a default language at the bottom of the SchoolCash Online site.
 - Type your first name, last name, and email address, and create a password.
 - Select a security question.
 - Select YES to receive email notifications. You will not receive any marketing emails. Selecting YES enables the system to send you notifications about school fees and items.
- 2. SchoolCash Online will send you a registration confirmation email. If you do not receive it, check your Spam folder.
- $3.\,$ Use your email address and password to log in.

How to add a student to your account

- 1. Sign in to SchoolCash Online through https://sperd.schoolcashonline.com.

 - Select your school name from the list.
 - Enter student details. The system is fully secure, with PCI certification.


How to make a payment or complete a form

BOARD MEETING

HIGHLIGHTS



Remembrance Day

Schools across the Division held ceremonies to honor the sacrifices made for our freedom. We extend our gratitude to the special guests who joined us, making these moments of remembrance truly meaningful.

Kutryk Presentation

Two community members from Two Hills approached the Board of Trustees seeking support for a tribute recognizing the accomplishments of Canadian astronaut and Two Hills School alumnus, Joshua Kutryk. Trustee Rajoo will represent the Division on the tribute planning committee.

Council of School Councils Meeting

The Board is hosting a Council of School Councils Engagement Meeting on November 25, 2024 at 7 p.m. at the St. Paul Education Division Office.

Criminal Record Check Bylaw

New provincial rules for local elections are resulting in boards and municipalities needing to decide whether to implement a bylaw requiring a criminal record check for individuals submitting nomination papers before running in an election. Such a bylaw would need to be passed before December 31, 2024. The new rules state that a conviction does not necessarily disqualify a candidate. Given the tight timeline, St. Paul Education trustees chose to defer the Board's response until after the next election and consider addressing a criminal record check requirement in policy for any elected trustees.

Election Update

Nomination packages for individuals who might be interested in running in the October 2025 school board election will be available in January 2025. The Board is not planning any changes to its ward structure.

New Curriculum Update

Alberta's government is working with education partners this fall to develop the junior high and career education curriculum. Drafts for Grades 7-9 mathematics and social studies, Grades 7-10 physical education and wellness, and Career and Life Management (CALM) will be created this school year, with input from teachers, system leaders, and subject experts. A public release of the refined curriculum is anticipated in spring 2025, and schools will have the option to pilot it in the 2025-26 school year.



Education Act Changes

Bill 27: Education Amendment Act, 2024, was introduced by the provincial government to improve transparency and support student choice regarding topics of gender identity, sexual orientation, and human sexuality. The bill also establishes a right to education during emergencies, emphasizing access to in-person learning, with new requirements for emergency learning plans. If passed, these changes are expected to take effect for school authorities on September 1, 2025.

December Board Meeting Date

The next Board meeting is scheduled for December 11, 2024, at 12:30 p.m. at the Division Office. A livestream will be available on the Division's YouTube channel.



Literacy Update

A literacy consultant has been hired to provide direct support to teachers and staff, enhancing their ability to build early literacy and reading skills. The Acadience tool has been instrumental in identifying areas where students need support, allowing for the development of targeted interventions. To further support a systemic approach to literacy, a speech-language pathologist has also been hired to aid language development.

Enrolment Update

Enrolment is down 70 students compared to last year but is 32 higher than projected, which will positively impact funding.
